Partners in (Repairing the Harm of) Crime

Over the last year, Washington County Community Circles and Eagle Brook Church have enjoyed conversations on the benefit of circles.

The church has been making changes in their approach to outreach and care using concepts from Brian Fikkert and Steve Corbett's book, "When Helping Hurts". The book specifically encouraged "circles" as a way to invite others to contribute and participate in their own solutions so that they could reconcile relationships that had been damaged or were in need of strengthening.

Several staff and volunteers from EBC were trained in circles concepts over the past year and that has provided great insight for new strategies for benevolence and providing deeper care for those in the faith community and beyond. This past spring, EBC hosted a gathering for a variety of non-profits to come together and learn how to also integrate circles into their programming.

In total, 6 non-profits across the Twin Cities were trained in the basic concepts of circles! EBC looks forward to continued learnings with WCCC as they provide such a valuable resource to those in our community looking for transformation!
